The Big Picture of GRIP

Each season of GRIP discipleship emphasizes 3 core practices:

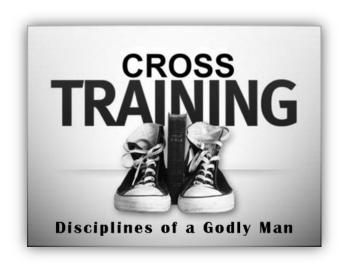
Action Points - Identify and pursue personal growth action points

Meeting with God - Regular unhurried time alone with God in His Word with a view toward love-motivated obedience

Brother to Brother – Regularly meet with at least one other brother where encouragement, challenge, and prayer can happen.

Some men coming into GRIP are a long way down the road to owning these three core practices. Others have been exposed to them, and perhaps have practiced them for short seasons in their past, but their lives are not currently characterized by them. For several men, these will be brand new practices. Our prayer is that this GRIP season will help you own these three practices, or rhythms, and that you will pass them on to others.

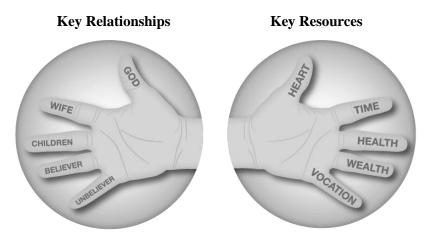
Here's a brief overview of how these 3 core practices will specifically come into play during this GRIP season.



The Practice of → Action Points

During the first two weeks of this discipleship season, we are asking you to set aside some time to get before God and think about your life. Where does He want to grow me? How can I join Him in this process? Our strong encouragement will be for you to carve out a 4-6 hour block of time and have a personal retreat to hear from God. For some, this extended time with God will be new and unfamiliar. Don't shy away from it on that account. However, if setting aside that large of a block of time proves unworkable, then divide that time into smaller chunks over this two week period. Either way, the point is slowing down to listen to God.

Listen and Reflect As you slow down to consider your life in God's presence, we will provide a grid to help you think through the **KEY RELATIONSHIPS** and the **KEY RESOURCES** God has given you.



We use the 5 fingers of a hand to represent these Key Relationships and Key Resources. The material in this guide will help ask God, "How can I bring these Key Relationships and Key Resources more in line with Your will for me?" It won't take much pondering before you are aware of areas that need growth: attitudes, character areas, disciplines, sin habits, intentions never acted upon, etc.

Write Down Action Points As a result of that reflective time, you will write down some action points. These actions points are not just "nice ideas". Rather, they are specific ways to obey God in this season of your life. Again, we'll give you some ideas here based on what other men have focused on in the past.

The Practice of → Meeting with God

Apart from the daily rhythm of reading God's Word with a posture to know Him and obey Him, it's highly unlikely that a man will ever be a disciple maker. If you are not regularly and personally processing God's Word, you are NOT on the path towards growth in God.

God has graciously given us His special revelation in the Bible (2Tim 3:16). It's the ONLY source where you can learn God's character, learn God's Gospel, and learn who you are in Christ. As we read the Scriptures, they read us (Heb 4:12). The Holy Spirit, who resides in each believer and mediates the presence of Christ to us, ministers the Word to us as we read and reflect. He corrects our wrong thinking; He convicts us of sin; He reminds us of God's promises; He speaks courage to our heart. If we are to walk by the Spirit and keep in step with the Spirit, then we need to be able to listen to the Spirit – and the Word of God is the Spirit's dialect. Why not make this season of GRIP discipleship your "stake in the ground" for personally owning the practice of regular unhurried time alone with God in His Word every day?

Bible Reading Plan This GRIP guide will help you be in God's Word at least 5 X per week. If you simply set aside the time, we'll direct you where to read. For this season, we'll start reading in the Gospel of Mark which describes the life and work of Jesus the Christ. We'll finish our season by reading Romans, which is the Gospel explained. You'll also have a stretch in the middle where you will practice choosing your own Bible passages to read.

Journaling Reading God's Word is a necessary start. But reading is not the same as processing and listening. Our goal in reading is communion with God and application of what He presses into our hearts. So, we will encourage you to process what you read by journaling. For some, this may be a new habit. We'll suggest a few different templates that you might use to guide your journaling. We'll also provide a few "prime the pump" questions for each Bible passage.

Passing On Reading and journaling will take any man a long way down the path to hiding God's Word in his heart. To seal the deal, we want each man to "pass on" one aspect of his time in God's Word with his family, GRIP partner, or someone else in his life. The idea is to **EXPRESS** what God has **IMPRESSED** on your heart and mind.

The Practice of \rightarrow Brother to Brother

In many facets of men's lives, community is a given. Men hunt together, play & watch sports together, work out together, do home improvement projects together, serve together, etc. However, when it comes to the Christian journey, many men have never learned how to do this together. It's clear from the Bible that the life God calls us to is a life in community. There's the assumption that we will be walking this journey together. Christianity is a team sport. No contact, no impact. We must give at least a few men access to our everyday lives.

And He appointed twelve, so that they would be <u>with</u> Him (Mk 3:14)...that I may be encouraged <u>together</u> with you...each of us by the other's faith(Rom 1:12)...my brother and fellow worker and fellow soldier (Phil 2:25)...Bear <u>one</u> <u>another's</u> burdens (Gal 6:2)...Encourage <u>one another</u> day after day(Heb 3:13)...Be <u>imitators</u> of me, just as I also am of Christ(1Cor 11:1)...walk according to the pattern you have in us(Phil 3:17)

Meet between large GRIP gatherings The backbone of GRIP is the face to face meeting between GRIP partners. Since the rhythm of our large gatherings is every three weeks, we expect that every GRIP pairing/triad will meet face to face at least once between our large gatherings. The most successful GRIP partnerships find a way to connect every week. In addition, a weekly phone call goes a long way to staying up to date.

Share Action Points During the first two weeks of GRIP you will have nailed down a short list of action points. It's vital that you share your action points with your GRIP partner. Our app makes this easy: Grip.focusedliving.com. Once shared, now you and your partner can strengthen each other's hands to follow through.

Ask Accountability Questions In addition to sharing your action points, you will be encouraged to share 3-5 accountability questions that you give permission to your GRIP partner to ask you weekly. These often relate to your action points or to areas of personal holiness. Again, you can share these via the grip.focusedliving.com app under the HAND Disciple finger.

Pray With your GRIP partner's action points and accountability questions in hand, now you have specific ways to lift each other up in prayer. Make it a habit of praying for each other every time you meet.

Rhythm of this Guide

In this guide, we have laid out a weekly rhythm of being in God's Word. We come to His Word to know and love Him...not to check off boxes and say, "I'm done!" Because of this relational purpose, we strongly encourage each man to process what he is reading by journaling. Most of the pages in this guide are for this purpose.

The rhythm we are presenting is a 5 day rhythm. We feel the pace and amount of Bible content it is doable. For most men, there will also be some margin to engage other Bible content related to your church or personal reading plan.

- God's GRIP on my Heart At the beginning of each week, we provide a page that will prompt you to review your action points. Coming to these often will prevent the "out of sight, out of mind" trap. Identify the 1 or 2 action points that are absolute musts for your focus this week. Remember, these action points are what you sensed God was impressing on you to do. Will you obey?
- Bible passages (4 days/week) Over this GRIP season you will be reading through the Bible books of Mark and Romans. You will also have a two week stretch of customized reading in the Bible. As you read, expect God to impress truths into your soul. The next page provides a few "templates" that have helped men to journal in response to their Bible reading.
- Scripture Memory (1 day/week) The last day of the 5 day rhythm will typically be Scripture memory. The point of memorizing scripture is so you will have it when you need it the most. If it resides in your heart, you can bring it back to your mind and your mouth. The verse(s) will come directly from the Bible reading. Some guys create some memory cards for easy review or utilize a scripture memory app on their phones. Feel free to use whatever Bible version you resonate with. A list of all the scriptures to memorize is found on page. 14.
- Weekly GRIP Growth summary At the end of each week (and at the end of each section) we provide a page to help you measure your progress (1Tim 4:15). Take a few minutes (perhaps on the Sabbath each week) to jot down
 - a couple highlights from God's Word to you
 - an instance of "passing on" a truth to your family / GRIP guy
 - what you did on your action points
 - what step you took toward walking a friend toward Christ

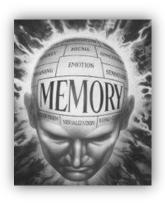

GRIP Scripture Memory

Throughout this season of GRIP discipleship, you will be hiding God's Word in your heart so you will have it when you need it the most. All the scripture comes from your devotional reading. At each of our large gatherings, your "meal ticket" will be to recite your scripture from the most recent section of Bible Reading. Here are all the passages for this season in one easy location.



Psalm 40:8

"I delight to do Your will, O my God; Your law is within my heart."

Mark 1:35

In the early morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left *the house*, and went away to a secluded place, and was praying there.

Mark 10:43b-45

...whoever wishes to become great among you shall be your servant; and whoever wishes to be first among you shall be slave of all. "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many."

Mark 5:19-20

...He said to him, "Go home to your people and report to them what great things the Lord has done for you, and *how* He had mercy on you." And he went away and began to proclaim in Decapolis what great things Jesus had done for him; and everyone was amazed.

Mark 16:15

And He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation."

Romans 1:16-17

For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For in it *the* righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, "BUT THE RIGHTEOUS *man* SHALL LIVE BY FAITH."

Romans 5:8-9

But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from the wrath of God through Him.

Romans 8:38-39

For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing, will be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Romans 15:13

Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you will abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Your HAND: Key Relationships

We have chosen the 'Hand' graphic because it is a useful way to visualize God's grip on our heart in order to live out His priorities as God's hands. In Matthew 22:34-40 Jesus teaches that the two greatest commands are to love God and love others. The thumb pointing upward represents our vertical love



relationship with the Father. Likewise, the other four fingers pointing horizontally represent the priority relationships in which the Lord has called us to invest His love. The fingers on the HAND become a simple way to bring focus to our living and to bring our hearts more in line with what God values. Discipleship, then, is helping each other grow to become disciplined in living the relationships God values in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Depending on your season of life, God will call you to prioritize slightly different relationships. The Thumb (God), Ring (Believer) and Pinky (Unbeliever) fingers are non-negotiable relationships central to your life as a Christ-follower. The Pointer and Middle fingers represent family or family-like relationships. These vary from person to person and even vary from different seasons of life. If you are married, the Pointer finger (Wife) is non-negotiable, as is the Middle finger (Children) if you have children still living under your roof. Again, these are starting points for focusing your relational investments in this season of your life. Other examples of Key Relationships might be girl friend, fiancé, siblings, aging parents, nieces, nephews, grandkids, roommate, etc.

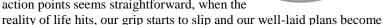
In this season of your life, who are your Key HAND Relationships? Write their names on the graphic below.

Your HAND: Key Resources

Most of us don't need convincing that these Hand relationships are Biblical, non-negotiable priorities of the Father. We have the sincere intention of faithfully living them out while helping another brother do the same. Though the plan to live out our action points seems straightforward, when the



reality of life hits, our grip starts to slip and our well-laid plans become like grasping a wet bar of soap.

Sometimes one relationship takes your full attention and energy. For instance, a crisis situation with your child or a health issue of your beautiful bride becomes your main focus. Therefore, since your family is a priority, your discipleship and outreach relationships might not get



the attention they need for a time. In these intense seasons, we encourage you to carry one another's burdens and keep pointing each other back to your relationship with the Lord as you focus on this one horizontal relationship.

Besides these crisis seasons that require magnifying one relationship over the others, there are other realities that may keep you from faithfully focusing on the relationships represented by the Hand. You see, though relationships are primary on God's heart, He has given us stewardship over some key resources as well. Specifically, he wants us to manage our **heart**, our **time**, our **health**, our **wealth**, and our **vocation**. God's design is that our good stewardship of these resources will help us keep a good grip on our priority relationships. However, they can also be used by our enemy to loosen our grip.

When one or more of these resource areas is out of alignment or neglected as to become unhealthy, then we start losing our grip on one or more of our key relationships. Wise GRIP partners will periodically help each other to examine these stewardship areas, especially if any of these key relationships seem to be stalled.

Listening to God

Now that you have been exposed to the HAND grid of Key Relationships and Key Resources, we want you to prayerfully consider your life.

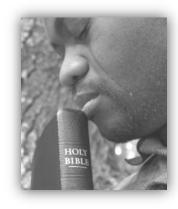
God, what insights would you give me about the Key Relationships You desire me to prioritize?

How can I better steward the Key Resources You have entrusted to me?"

We envision this prayerful reflection happening in one of two ways.

Personal Retreat - Many men will choose a half day personal retreat as their way to think and pray through their HAND action points. This half day (4-6 hours) of concentrated time of personal reflection has proved a rich blessing to GRIP men through the years. We strongly recommend this path – especially if you've not done this before. The overwhelming feedback from men who have experienced this personal retreat has been very positive. This retreat would need to be **completed** by February 11th in preparation of our GRIP large gathering on February 12th. The following pages guide you through how this time might be ordered.

10 Days of Discovery – Some men will choose to spread this reflection over ten days (ten ~1 hour sessions). This path helps the man who can't carve out one large chunk of time. Each day would focus on one key relationship or one key resource. Section 1 of this GRIP Guide is written for this ten session format which would take place between January 30 and February 11th. (See pages 23-61)



Action Points

Whether you choose the concentrated retreat or 10 days of discovery, LISTEN to God and hear what He would have you DO. Expect God to impress some things on your heart to do. This "DOing" is what we refer to as "working our Action Points." These Actions Points are not just "nice ideas". Rather, they are specific ways to obey God in this season of your life. They carry the weight of "I would be disobedient to God if I didn't pursue these actions." Allow God to impress on you one or two action points per finger that He desires for you to emphasize over this next season of your life.

Now, take a breath. God is not out to overwhelm you with a long todo list. He knows that you are but dust (Ps 103:14)! And yet, He deeply desires for us to press on to maturity, looking more and more like Jesus (1Tim 4:15; Rom 8:29; Phil 2:12-13; 3:13,14; Heb 6:1; 12:1). Dallas Willard has written, "Grace is not opposed to effort, it's opposed to earning." In the environment of God's Grace, let's put forth effort towards these action points.

Action Points usually take one of a few forms:

- > establish a new pattern (i.e. spiritual discipline, helpful practice, etc)
- **stop an existing pattern** (i.e. sin habit, a hindrance (Heb 12:1)
- **a one-time action** (forgive, apologize, write letter, have a conversation, read a book, attend a seminar, etc)

In the material that follows, we present a few action points per finger to give you a sense of what others have pursued. When formulating action points, try to make them SMART*

SMART Action Points*

S pecific – not fuzzy

M easurable – you know when you are done

A ttainable – possible to do

R elevant - meaningful

T ime Limited – can show progress between meetings

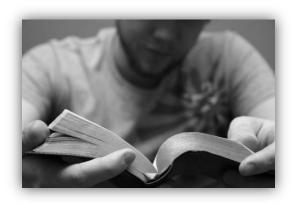

Our grip.focusedliving.com WebApp is specifically designed for you to enter and share you action points with your GRIP partner. The App allows you to concentrate on a few "Active" Action Points, while classifying other Action Points as "Inactive." (As men, we can only focus on a couple action points at a time. This feature allows you to keep action points "on deck" for when you complete others and make room for these new ones.)

PERSONAL RETREAT

Before Your Retreat

- Carve out 4-6 hours on your calendar Perhaps Saturday morning, Sunday afternoon, or taking a half day off during work. Some men get up early on Sunday morning and spend 2 hours with the Lord. Then they go to Sunday worship with their family, but return home (while their family remains for Sunday school) for another 2 hours of focused time before lunch with the family.
- Choose a quiet place Find a comfortable place where you will be undistracted and uninterrupted out of your normal routine. A park, library, friend's lake house, an empty room at church, etc.
- What to Bring Bible, grip.focusedliving.com WebApp, pen, personal journal
- **Do** consider fasting a meal so you are reminded of your real hunger for God. **Do** get a good night's sleep the night before. **Do** let your family and GRIP partner know when you are planning to have this retreat so they can be prayerful. **Do** consider taking a <u>first pass</u> at reading the REFLECTION questions on pages 24, 28, 32, 36, 40, 44, 48, 52, 56, 60 and highlight a couple under each finger you know you need to really grapple with during your retreat.
- **Don't** look at texts, emails, social media during your retreat. **Don't** pack it too full of activity so you aren't quiet before the Lord.



Flow for Actual Retreat

There is not one "right way" to have a personal retreat. Remember, your goal is to hear from God. A suggested agenda follows. You may end up changing the order, changing time allotments, or adding other elements. Look at it as an extended time with your best friend!

Spiritual preparation (30 mins)

This is a time to rehearse God's weightiness in your life. It's a time to be really honest with him. It's a time to express your heart. It might include Bible reading, praying, singing worship songs, confessing, etc



"Father, increase the sensitivity of my heart to hear Your Word and to obey Your will. May my life reflect what is important to Your heart and may I pursue the things that You value. Help me meditate on Your Word and pour out the desires of my heart in prayer. Grant me insight into what Action Points You have for my life this GRIP season. And motivate me by the

depth of Your love and grace. Use this time to cleanse my heart, clarify my thoughts, and heighten my sense of fellowship with You."

Evaluate Key Relationships (90 -120 mins)

Pages 23 - 41 are designed to walk a man through the process of evaluating his Key Relationships. For each of the 5 fingers on the Key Relationship Hand, you will see the following:

- A relevant Bible passage to read along with a couple questions*
- A series of Reflection questions. (Note: These reflection questions are also included in the grip.focusedliving.com WebApp under the "Hands" button.)
- Blank space to jot down your reflections
- Example Action Points that you might adapt
- Space to write out 1 or 2 action points.

*You will notice that **pages 23 - 41** are formatted for the man who chose the "10 Discovery Days". That rhythm is basically a normal quiet time with God with the HAND reflection questions added. During your retreat, you may not have the time or capacity to read each Bible portion for each finger. No worries! You can skip it during the retreat and use it to guide your daily quiet times for the first week of GRIP.

Prayer walk (45 mins)

Why not go for a walk and continue the conversation with Jesus? Try to be aware of any anxiety or worry or stress. Cast these cares on Him. Lift up each relationship and entrust that person into God's hands.

Evaluate Key Resources (60 – 90 mins)

Remember, sometimes our intentions to prioritize our key relationships are short circuited because we are not managing our resources well. Where are you out of balance? How can you improve your stewardship of these God-given resources?

Pages 42-62 are designed to walk a man through the process of evaluating his Key Resources. For each of the 5 fingers on the Key Resource Hand, you will see the following:

- A relevant Bible passage to read along with a couple questions*
- A series of Reflection questions. (Note: These reflection questions are also included in the grip.focusedliving.com WebApp under the "Hands" button.)
- Blank space to jot down your reflections
- Example Action Points that you might adapt
- Space to write out 1 or 2 action points.

Record Action Points (30 mins)

You will have had many ideas during the retreat. Which one or two ideas do you sense are priorities given to you by God? These are the action points you should write down. Record your action points in one place that is easily shareable with your GRIP partner. The grip.focusedliving.com webapp is the designed for this purpose. It is SO MUCH EASIER to practice accountability with another brother when you have each other's action points in a concise form. Note that when using the grip.focusedliving.com webapp, your HAND action points are automatically shared with your GRIP partner.

^{*} You can skip the scripture during the retreat and use it to guide your daily quiet times for the second week of GRIP.

Your Heart

The core of discipleship is God's grip on your heart. The wise man knows his heart. Your heart encompasses more than you might think at first thought. When you consider your heart, think of your motives, your purity, your personal holiness. Your heart is also were your dreams, ambitions, passions are rooted. On the negative side, your heart is where past hurts, sin habits, shame, and guilt reside along with other stresses and distractions of this world.

Represented by the thumb on the Key Resources Hand, your heart is closely related to your relationship with God. In discipleship, the heart of the matter is the matter of the heart. God has called us to "guard our heart" to "examine our heart" and to invite the Holy Spirit to "search" it (Prov 4:23; 1Cor 11:28; Ps 139:23-24; Matt 6:21). You must constantly and honestly discern the state of your heart. Don't leave His presence until He grips your heart. If our heart is holding onto sin, hurts, wrong thinking, disappointment, guilt, etc we will never be ALL IN regarding the Key Relationships to which God has called us. What kind of steward are you of your heart?

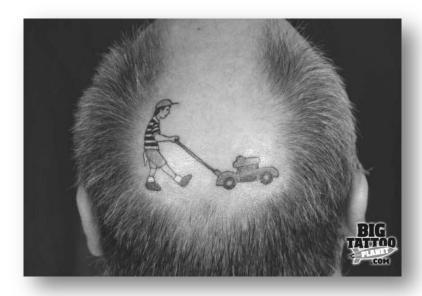

- Gifting What things come easily and naturally for me? What am I really good at? What ability has God entrusted to me that could be a blessing to others?
- Ministry Do I see my job as a way to glorify God with my excellence? Do the people at my work gravitate toward me or away from me?
- Serving Am I using my spiritual gifts and calling during this season? Am I doing a few things well, or am I overcommitted and operating in the flesh? How is my servant attitude? Would others classify me as "part of the problem" or "part of the solution"? Is God my audience of One?
- **Volunteering** Am I involved in my community so I can spread the aroma of Christ? Wherever volunteer, am I dependable and reliable?

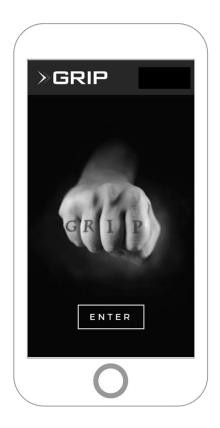

3 Ways to Process the Word

WHO are you addressing?

Always start your time in prayer with a reverent recognition that you are coming into the presence of your Eternal Father and Gracious Lord!

WHAT is God saying?

Slowly read the passage 2X as if you were there. Feel the emotions; sense the relationships; smell the surroundings; hear the crowds. Record insights, phrases, commands, promises that stand out.

SO WHAT is God saying to you?

Stop to reflect and listen. What most grabbed your attention, stirred your mind or gripped your heart? Why?

NOW WHAT is God asking you to do?

What will you do with the truth God has revealed to you? Write out a short, heartfelt prayer to the Lord in response to this time with Him.

S.O.A.P.

S cripture Listen and meditate on God's word as you read.

O bservation What insights and observations did you have on this portion of scripture? (i.e., words, phrases, themes, connections, etc)

A pplication The way I will obey God's message to me today is...

P rayer Father, hear my prayer that I write from my heart in response to our time of fellowship together...

Lectio Divina (sacred reading)

READ Gently read, listening with the ears of your heart.

MEDITATE Slowly reread the passage. Note any word or phrase that draws your attention...or that "sparkles. Repeat the word or phrase that has chosen you, asking God, "What do you want me to learn from this today?" Ask your heart, "Why this word, why here, why now?

PRAY Read the passage a third time and savor it. Let it move you to place yourself before the One who has invited you to intimate dialogue. "Lord, how are you inviting me to respond?" Speak from your heart.

CONTEMPLATE/REST Review the text one more time. Sit quietly. Let the Holy Spirit speak to your heart. Let go of the text (mentally) and simply rest in God. As the fragrance of God's Word fills you, enjoy the sweetness of communion with the God of the scriptures.

You'll spend the first month of this GRIP discipleship season reading through the book of Mark. It's the shortest of the four Gospels at 16 chapters. The author, John Mark, was a close friend of the Apostle Peter (1Peter 5:13) and he most likely received much of the gospel's content from conversations with Peter. We also see John Mark in the book of Acts, as he joined Paul and Barnabas, his cousin, on the first missionary journey (Acts 13:5).

In this gospel, Mark has a bigger emphasis on what Jesus did than on what He taught. It's definitely a book of action as we see from the frequent use of the word "immediately." It's written with a Gentile Roman audience in mind and excludes Jewish genealogies and has fewer Old Testament quotes than the other gospels. For more detailed background information on this, or any, Bible book, consult the introduction to Mark in your study Bible.

As you spend the next weeks walking in the sandals of the disciples, let your wonder of Jesus Christ, the Son of God capture your heart, mind and soul once again. Like the disciples, you too have heard the call of Jesus. You too have responded by repenting and believing. And now, 2000 years later you are following Jesus. In fact, during this GRIP season, you are helping another brother also follow Jesus more closely! In the first verse Mark writes, "The beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ." May you come to appreciate that your faith is based on the historical God/man Jesus the Christ.

Time to Meet with Your GRIP Partner!

No contact, no impact! There is no substitute for meeting nose to nose at least bi-weekly to assess God's current grip on our heart. Weekly is best. This face to face time could be while working side by side on a project, driving to a ministry appointment, enjoying some



recreation, taking a prayer walk, sharing a meal together, etc. How you get together is totally up to you. It will probably be dictated by convenience and the rhythm of your lives. Just think of how many different situations, places, and times Jesus met His disciples! For those first disciples, class was always in session!

What should we cover when we meet?

- Pass On Word Make it a habit to pass on one truth or insight that God has impressed on your heart from your time alone with Him in His Word. Having your <u>GRIP Guide</u> journal when you meet will be helpful.
- **Action Points Don't attempt to discuss all the action points each time you meet. Always discuss the "Thumb" (relationship with God). Then, choose one other Key Relationship "finger" and give an action point progress report. Listen, ask questions, suggest ideas, encourage, challenge. Give each other permission to poke with accountability (Heb 10:24-25).
- Accountability Questions Share your answers to the accountability questions you mutually established at the beginning of the GRIP season. We recommend typing your list of 3-5 questions as one action point on your "Ring Finger" (relationship with disciple) in the FLM HAND app. That way you will always have your GRIP partner's questions.
- **Pray** No prayer…no power! Always set aside some minutes to pray for each other in both successes and failures.

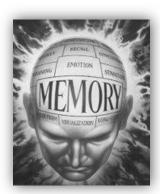

STRENGTHENING YOUR HANDS: Accountability



God understood that King David could not live a 'fivefingered' life by himself. So, He gave him a friend in Jonathan

who would "strengthen his hands in the Lord." The two then "made a covenant before the Lord" which involved a growing friendship based on a rich accountability relationship (I Sam 23:16-18). Authentic, biblical discipleship requires consistent accountability. If you are to grow as a disciple of Christ whose heart is gripped by God's hands, then you must have a 'Jonathan' in your life who will help your hands do what is on God's heart. So what does accountability look like?

Accountability Defined

Accountability is consistently asking each other on earth the same questions God will ask us in heaven in order to help each other become faithful finishers. In other words, accountability is helping a brother in Christ grow as five finger man by helping him become the husband, father, friend, leader or servant that God has called him to be! What are some of the questions the Lord is going to ask you as one of His sons about your heart, mind, money, priorities, relationships, attitudes and when you stand before Him?

Countdown to Accountability

The Lord has wired His men with a real sense of responsibility and urgency as they realize that very soon each man will be asked to account for the management of the life God has so graciously given to him. (Luke 16:1-13; 19:11-27)

"We have as our ambition, whether at home or absent, to be pleasing to Him. For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may be recompensed for his deeds in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad." (II Cor. 5:9-10)

"Each man's work will become evident; for the day will show it, because it is to be revealed with fire; and the fire itself will test the quality of each man's work. If any man's work which he has built upon it remains, he shall receive a reward. If any man's work is burned up, he shall suffer loss; but he himself shall be saved, yet so as through fire." (1 Cor. 3:13-15)

"For we will all stand before the judgment seat of God ... So then each one of us will give an account of himself to God." (Rom 14:10,12)

Building Below The Waterline

A man set out to build the most spectacular sailboat in the harbor. Sparing no expense, he outfitted his boat with decks of rare teak, polished brass fittings and colorful nylon sails. He could hardly wait to impress his friends. One day during a bit of financial hardship he foolishly reasoned, "Since others never see below the waterline I will invest money building only where others can see above the waterline!"

On the day of its maiden voyage a storm capsized his yacht because its small keel did not have enough weight below the waterline. Accountability adds a keel of **character**, weight of **wisdom** and rudder of **righteousness** below the water line where it really counts! Are you a light weight?



Asking the Tough Questions. Living the Tough Answers

If you are serious about adding weight below the waterline by becoming a five fingered man with God's grip fully on your heart, then you need to understand that "Better is open rebuke than love that is concealed; faithful are the wounds of a friend, but deceitful are the kisses of an enemy" (Prov 27:5-6). Most of us don't naturally do what is <u>EXPECTED</u> of us, but, rather, what is <u>INSPECTED</u>! Can you imagine the growth that would happen if you and your GRIP guy gave each other permission to "poke" your life each week with a few questions? So, take the initiative to invite inspection of your life. ("Let us consider how to stimulate one another to love and good deeds." Heb 10:24).

Here are some example questions to ask each other as GRIP partners.

- 1. Do you love Jesus more now than when we last met? How specifically have you expressed your love in obedience?
- 2. How have you been the spiritual servant-leader of your family?
- 3. Are you praying for and with your wife daily?
- 4. Have you been with a woman in the past week that could be viewed as compromising? Have you been using His gift of sex the way God designed it to be used?
- 5. Have all your financial dealings been filled with integrity?
- 6. What have been your real motives behind...?
- 7. What idol is eating your lunch and keeping you from pursuing Christ? Do you need help to behead it?
- 8. Have you just lied to me?

Holding A Friend's Feet To The Fire...

Without Burning His Toes

There are two aspects of accountability. One is helping each other follow through on our sincere intentions to grow by living out your Action Points. The other is to address areas of sin in order to help each other live victorious holy lives. The following principles will help you learn to grow in accountability in both of these.

- 1. Take a long look at your own life first! Don't get defensive if the friend approaches in love! "First take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother's eye" (Matt 7:5). "Brethren, even if a man is caught in any trespass, you who are spiritual, restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness; each one looking to yourself, lest you too be tempted." (Gal. 6:1,3,4).
- **2. The motivation is always love!** "Through love serve one another. For the whole Law is fulfilled in one word, in the statement, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself'" (Gal 5:13-14). "This is My commandment, that you love one another just as I have loved you. Greater love has no one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends" (Jn 15: 12-13). "A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for times of adversity" (Prov 17:17).
- **3. Share from weakness and not from strength.** "Confess your sins to one another..." (James 5:16)
- **4. Always pray together.** "Pray for (with) one another so that you might be healed" (James 5:16)
- **5.** Accountability is best one on one or in a small group. "If your brother sins, go and reprove him in private; if he listens to you, you have won your brother. But if he does not listen to you, take one or two

more with you, so that by the mouth of two or three witnesses every fact may be confirmed" (Matt. 18:15-16).

- **6. Always use a velvet-covered brick.** "If any man is caught in sin you who are spiritual restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness" (Gal. 6:1).
- **7.** The goal is always restoration, never accusation. "Brethren, even if a man is caught in any trespass, you who are spiritual, restore such a one in a spirit of gentleness" (Gal 6:1).
- **8.** Christ Himself promises to be present during awkward times of accountability and confrontation because you are doing His work. "For where two or three have gathered together in My name (context: for the express purpose of holding a brother accountable), there I am in their midst" (Matt. 18:18-20)
- **9. Choose your moments carefully.** "Then the Lord sent Nathan to David. And he came to him..." (2 Sam. 12:1).
- **10.** Preserve your brother's reputation by assuring total confidentiality. "If your brother sins, go and reprove him in private" (Matt. 18:15-16)
- 11. Be direct making sure to yet offer the assurance of complete forgiveness! Nathan then said to David, "You are the man! Thus says the Lord God of Israel, 'It is I who anointed you king over Israel and it is I who delivered you from the hand of Saul. 'Why have you despised the word of the Lord by doing evil in His sight? You have struck down Uriah the Hittite with the sword, have taken his wife to be your wife, and have killed him with the sword of the sons of Ammon. Then David said to Nathan, "I have sinned against the Lord." And Nathan said to David, "The Lord also has taken away your sin." (2 Sam. 12:7, 9, 13)
- **12.** Stay away from men who say they are accountable 'only to the Lord.' We are accountable ultimately to the Lord, but also to each other. (1John 1:7)

Long for the pure milk of the word, so that by it you may grow in respect to salvation (1Peter 2:2)

You are responsible for your spiritual growth. Not your pastor, not your wife, not your Bible study leader. You! Learning to feed yourself a healthy spiritual meal is a practice that marks your spiritual maturing. Sermons, blogs, podcasts, books, commentaries or Christian radio can all be helpful. But, in all of these, the Bible content is delivered to us pre-digested. Someone else has done the hard work of choosing from the menu, preparing, chewing and digesting God's truth to make it easy for you. Instead of relying on them, let's get in the habit of feeding ourselves. Start by asking, "What diet in God's Word will help me grow best in this season?" Consider some of the following scenarios to help you understand what diet from God's truth you might need to grow strong in Him.

I need to understand <u>the Big Picture of the Bible</u>. → Read the **Bible in** a **Year**.

I need to <u>slow down and chew on</u> what God is saying to me? \rightarrow **Read shorter chunks** of scripture and **journal longer**.

I am in a <u>particular life-season</u> (i.e. parenting, stress, health issues, financial questions, relational problems, etc) where I'm asking, "What does God say about this?" → Find and read passages that speak to your life situation. Use a concordance and your Grip Team to help.

I want to master <u>a particular message</u> from a classic Bible passage, chapter or whole Bible book? → Read this **same scripture everyday** for a couple of weeks, journaling and **memorizing key verses**.

I heard some teaching on <u>a topic that impacts me</u> and am hungry for more. I want to make sure it is Biblical. → Study the verses taking advantage of various Bible helps.

I have been faithfully reading, but don't feel like I'm connecting with<u>God?</u> → Read shorter portions repetitively and listen and pray more.

I'm receiving too many truth units each week to apply (sermon, Sunday School, Men's Forum, small group, spiritual book, Christian radio, Grip, daily quiet time and podcast)! → Say "no" to a couple of these

good inputs to create some mental and emotional margin to actually **apply.** Arrange my devotions around the Bible content from one or two these inputs.

You're getting the idea. Your spiritual growth requires customized decisions about the spiritual food you are consuming. Now, let's be clear. The scriptures say that God is the one who causes our growth (1Cor 3:7; Phil 1:6). But He desires for us to take ownership of putting ourselves in front of His Word where He can grow us.

Assignment

We've cleared the next two weeks for you to come up with your own diet of Bible reading that you think will help you grow most in this season. Take some time with your GRIP partner to think this through. Here are some ideas to help you:

- What scenario from above best describes you?
- The YouVersion Bible app has many short reading plans by topic. Maybe one of these is right for you.
- Perhaps both GRIP partners would benefit from choosing the same Bible passages. Or, maybe it would be good for you and your wife to be in the same place in the Word for a couple weeks.
- If you're wanting something topical, but aren't sure what passages might be good, ask guys on your GRIP team or some of the Focused Living staff.

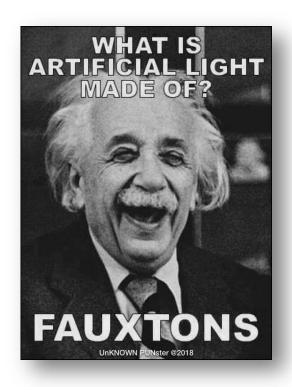

WARNING!

For the love of Christ controls us, having concluded this, that one died for all, therefore all died; and He died for all, so that they who live might no longer live for themselves, but for Him who died and rose again on their behalf.

2Corinthians 5:14-15

Hands are designed for action. By now you have been faithfully living out your hand Action Points. Let us offer a strong word of caution that will motivate over the long haul. You see, we live in a culture that applauds **spectacular starters** but rarely witnesses **faithful finishers**. It is God's desire that you finish your life faithfully by becoming more and more obedient to Christ's last command of disciple making.

Rightly motivated, discipleship focuses on the **Person** of Christ and what He has done, not on

performance and what we need to do. If you want to gain traction in life, don't be overwhelmed by a **list** of all you think you have to **DO** for God. Rather, overflow in His **love** by what He has already **DONE** for you! The only lasting motivation for long term growth in discipleship will be responding to the Father's love through Christ, not trying to earn it! Press on and press in toward the One Who has His grip on you (Phil 3:12-14)!

Suppose a friend needed your help moving and gave you a list of 25 things to do... packing boxes, dismantling shelves, loading the truck, etc. No problem. You do a few of the items on the list. But, before long, he asks you to fix lunch, take out the trash, paint the house and wash his car. Suddenly your attitude sours and you quit!

Now, imagine you are driving along the highway with your family and this same friend is in the car behind yours. All of a sudden, a huge truck careens down the ramp and smashes into your van, causing it to flip upside-down and burst into flames. Your family hangs unconscious from the seatbelts helplessly trapped near death. Being the first person on the scene, your friend crawls into the vehicle cutting each of you loose from the melting seatbelts. He pulls you to safety, just as the van explodes. In the process his hands become charred, useless stumps. His face is scarred beyond recognition, requiring countless reconstructive surgeries. The smoke destroys his sight, rendering him permanently

blind. The toxic fumes singe his vocal chords so that he can no longer speak. And the explosion severs his spinal cord, bringing paralysis.

What is your attitude now that your friend saved your life? You will gladly do the list of 25 things and ask for another! Why? Because you are no longer motivated by a <u>LIST</u> of things you have to **DO** for him. Your heart is motivated by his <u>LOVE</u>



and what he has **DONE** for you! You love him deeply, because he loved you and demonstrated it with this sacrificial action. And your love willingly expresses itself in working the to-do list. It's something you **GET TO** do, not something you've **GOT TO** do!

Until you are overwhelmed by the *LOVE* of God through Jesus Christ at the cross, discipleship will remain just one more thing on your already overloaded "to do" *LIST*. But when you preach the Gospel to yourself daily, God's love will motivate and compel you to disciple for a lifetime. It will no longer be a pain, but a privilege; no longer a hassle, but an honor; no longer work, but a wonder! (1 John 5:3)

Because of the Cross, discipleship is now an <u>overflowing response</u> to God's love for you in Christ (1 John 4:7-11). Your obedience is now love motivated rather than list activated. Jesus repeated this close connection between love and obedience five times on the night He went to the cross.

- "If you love Me, you will keep My commandments." (John 14:15)
- "He who has My commandments and keeps them is the one who loves Me." (14:21)
- "If anyone loves Me, he will keep My word." (14:23)
- "He who does not love Me does not keep My words." (14:24)
- "If you keep My commandments, you will abide in My love." (15:1)

When it comes to discipleship, do you see it as one more thing on your already overcrowded list of things to do or will you welcome it as priority because you are responding to God's love? Bottom line...are you motivated by your list or His love?

Interestingly, 2000 years before the cross, on the same mountain (Moriah), this love-motivated obedience was being lived out by Abraham. In Genesis 22:1-19, God tested Abraham to see what was in his heart in order to determine if he loved his son more than Him. God will also test you with the things you love. There is no testimony without a test! You remember the story. God asks Abe to sacrifice his only son, Isaac, the son of promise. And Abraham's obedience pointed to his love for God.

Abraham's obedience was...

IMMEDIATE OBEDIENCE [2-3] "Take now your son..."

DETERMINED OBEDIENCE [2-4] "Sacrifice him...on the 3rd day."

CONFIDENT OBEDIENCE [5] "We will worship and return!"

PEACEFUL OBEDIENCE [8] "God will provide!"

SACRIFICIAL OBEDIENCE [10-12] "You have not withheld."

You'll invest the remainder of this GRIP discipleship season reading through the book of Romans. If Mark was "the beginning of the Gospel of Jesus Christ the Son of God" (Mark 1:1), then Romans is the further explanation of this Gospel (Rom 1:15). The author, Paul, a bond-servant and apostle of Christ (and also a Jewish attorney by training) sets out to thoroughly explain the Gospel and this new life in Christ to a group of new believers whom he had never met. It will definitely feel different than reading the narrative of Mark. For more detailed background information on Romans, consult your study Bible.

Mark's gospel culminates in the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus. Now, carried along by the Holy Spirit, Paul sets out to explain the ramifications of the crucifixion and the resurrection and the indwelling Holy Spirit. What does all of this mean and what does it look like to live out this new life between Sundays?

As you spend these post-Easter weeks hearing Paul explain the cross and the resurrection, may you find yourself daily "presenting your bodies a living and holy sacrifice" (Rom 12:1) to the One Who transferred you from death to life.

Now all glory to God, who is able to make you strong, just as my Good News says. This message about Jesus Christ has revealed his plan for you Gentiles, a plan kept secret from the beginning of time. But now as the prophets foretold and as the eternal God has commanded, this message is made known to all Gentiles everywhere, so that they too might believe and obey him. All glory to the only wise God, through Jesus Christ, forever. Amen.

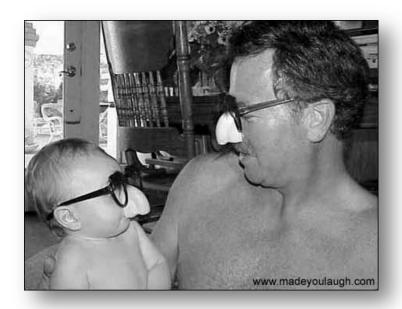

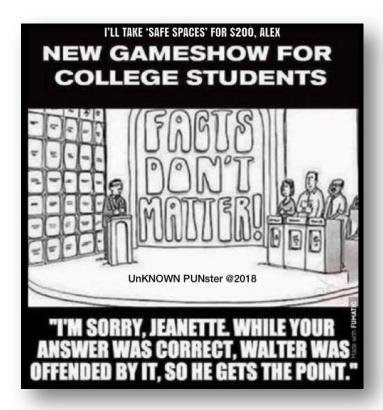

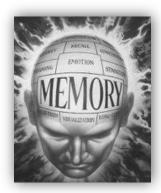
